FINANCIAL SECRETARY NOTES

Brothers, quarterly dues notices have gone out, and all updated membership cards have been mailed out to those who paid. As usual, there are a few stragglers. Supreme has ordered a hiatus on final withdrawals for the next two months in hopes that the State Membership Chairman can reach them and retain them.

I have e-mailed quarterly statements to some 20 members who are over a year indebted. The bad news is that 75% of them ignored us (e-mails got through, too). This really hurts. A couple of Brothers though have responded, one of which not only paid up, but paid a FULL 5 YEARS in ADVANCE! Would that all of you Brothers could do that! Just one easy credit card charge and he got a "Sep 30, 2020" stamped on his card. Our State Per Capita tax this year came to \$1,537.40 Supreme was sent a check (semi-annual) for their various taxes and assessments for \$622.62 We need ALL to pay their dues, or resign/withdraw. If you have a compelling reason to not pay, tell me, because I must take it up privately with the Grand Knight for determination of relief.

Our semi-annual Council Audit will be held on Sunday, the 2nd of August at my house at 2PM. Just a couple of hours before the 4th Degree Installation begins at the Hall. Once the Audit is concluded, the annual budget will be drawn up. Committee Directors: PLEASE GIVE/E-MAIL ME YOUR BUDGETS FOR THE COMING YEAR, OR ELSE YOUR PROGRAMS WILL PROBABLY NOT BE properly FUNDED. An example of this void was the appeal that came late last year to help with funds to supply the Bishop with travelling vestments. Although the funds were raised from the collective participation of Assemblies and other Councils, our Council had no choice but to "pass the hat" if we wanted to support him. It never got passed. A shame. We were the only Council not to contribute.
